Working Conditions of Nurses in Switzerland: SCOHPICA Findings

This conference will offer key insights into the current situation of nurses' working conditions in Switzerland, drawing on findings from SCOHPICA and the National Monitoring of Nursing Professions.

Since 2022, SCOHPICA has been collecting data on the career paths, retention intentions, and working conditions of healthcare professionals in Switzerland. At a time when nurses' working conditions are in the spotlight due to discussions surrounding the new Federal Act on Working Conditions in Nursing, we will present specific results from nearly 3,000 nurses across Switzerland. These findings highlight key aspects of the current public debate on working conditions within the healthcare sector.

The National Monitoring of Nursing Professions—published in July 2024—combines several data sources, including five indicators derived from the SCOHPICA cohort, to provide regular updates on the state of nursing staff in Switzerland. This monitoring tool is an important instrument for evaluating measures taken to implement the nursing initiative and offers valuable insights into the perspectives and experiences of nursing staff.
